- For multiple-choice questions, four incorrect answers will cancel one correct answer (for every incorrect answer, there will be a deduction of 0.25 points). This does not apply to open-ended or matching questions.
- Your total grade for each section will be converted to 5 for CAT 1 and 15 for CAT 2.
