## GENERAL REMINDERS

- For CAT 1, students must be in the classroom by 10.15 at the latest. For CAT 2, students must be in the classroom by 09.15 at the latest.
- Students must use a pen in the Writing exam.
- Only answers marked on the optic forms will be considered valid. Answers written on the booklet will not be marked.
- No extra time will be given for the transfer of answers onto the optic forms.
- Students taking the exam are responsible for filling in the optic forms correctly.
- For multiple-choice questions with four options, three incorrect answers will cancel one correct answer (for every incorrect answer, there will be a deduction of 0.33 points). For multiple-choice questions with five options, four incorrect answers will cancel one correct answer (for every incorrect answer, there will be a deduction of 0.25 points). This does not apply to open-ended or matching questions.
- Your total grade for each section will be converted to 5 for CAT 1 and 15 for CAT 2.
