GENERAL REMINDERS

- For the Reading and Listening exams, students must be in the classroom by 13.50 at the latest.
- For the Writing and Grammar & Vocabulary exams, students must be in the classroom by 09.00 at the latest.
- Only answers marked on the optic forms will be considered valid. Answers written on the booklets will not be marked.
- No extra time will be given for the transfer of answers onto the optic forms other than the Listening section.
- Students taking the exam are responsible for filling in the optic forms correctly.
- For multiple-choice questions with four options, there will be an extra deduction of 0.33 points for every incorrect answer. For multiple-choice questions with five options, there will be an extra deduction of 0.25 points for every incorrect answer. This does not apply to matching questions.
- Students must use a pen in the Writing exam.
